And just when we find ourselves in a locked room, like the disciples after the crucifixion, may we listen for the knocking on the door. May we open the door and be reminded that Jesus is alive. And not only is he alive, but he wants to live through us, so that we too may be doors of God's love to those around us.

Will you trust God with the impossibilities in your life this Easter?



Parenting Study to Begin March 10th

Willow UMC will be offering a free parenting study for parents of children of all ages. The study time will be utilizing a parenting series by Jim Williams who is a national parenting advocate and speaker and the director of Parent Education and Asset Development for STARS, a school based program helping students make healthy lifestyle choices.

This study will begin with "Parenting 101: The Basics of Becoming a Proactive Parent." This is a 4 week study with the following titles: "Navigating Through Troubled Waters," "Developing a Parenting Plan," "Managing the 'Balancing Act," and "Keeping Your Family Strong."

"This Proactive Parenting series is about choosing to live in a circle of influence with God in the center. It's about learning how to parent with a plan so that you can become the kind of parent that God wants you to be."

The class will be meeting on the 2nd and 4th Sundays of each month from 11:00am to 12:00pm in the home of Tyler and Jennifer Johnson, who live about 2 minutes from the Willow UMC at 25305 Bernadine Rd, New Boston.
