A NOTE FROM PASTOR BRAD:

Over the last several months I have attended numerous baseball games watching my two grandsons play ball. It's been exciting and frustrating at times. What I find interesting are the parents of all the young players. Many of them will take a day off work on Friday to get their child to the game played on Friday morning and then make sure their child is available to play any time on Saturday and Sunday. There

is a definite commitment and faithfulness to the kids, the ball team, and the game of baseball. What if there was that level of faithfulness and commitment to involvement in church by the parents? In the following comments Professor Dean makes a similar point except from a different perspective.

"You can't lead where you don't go." So says Kenda Creasy Dean, a professor of youth ministry at Princeton Theological Seminary, in a video interview on the ChurchNext website. She's speaking of Christian parents who are eager to drop their children off at church to learn the rudiments of the faith, but who rarely come to church themselves and have never shared with their children their own faith stories.

Church, she says, is not like the multitude of soccer and baseball games to which so many parents dutifully chauffeur their overbooked children. No one expects these parents to don a uniform, jog out onto the field and start playing alongside their progeny. Cheering from the stands is enough.

Not so with the church. If children don't see their parents playing the game, chances are slim to none they'll remain active participants themselves. In all too many cases, once these teenagers become young adults, they'll walk away from the church of their youth -- and very possibly from Christianity as well.

Why is that? Because, even in the sullen independence of their teenage years, these young people still quietly look to their parents as their leading spiritual exemplars.

"Parents need to tell children their own faith stories," Dean continues. "We can bring them to church and tell them all kinds of wonderful faith stories, but the most important story they need to hear is ours."

As we have the opportunity may you and I tell of our love of Jesus through not only our words, but just as importantly, through our commitment and involvement in God's work through the church.
